Along with the discernment of truth which the conscience allows, the verdict of conscience also remains with us as a lasting witness to the good we have done or the evil we have done. A conscience which holds us accountable is also a pledge of hope and mercy. Though it may bear witness to the evil we have done, it also reminds us of our need to ask forgiveness.

Conscience is not an independent ability to decide what do, or which assesses an act already performed by him. It is true, what is good, or what is evil. As we have seen, some wrongly believe conscience is the ability of men to make a moral decision autonomously for himself while "liberated" from objective truth.
