

Chapter Three – Moral good for the life of the Church and of the world

As the Church offers discernment regarding these erroneous theories about morality, she does not simply refute them in some denouncement. Instead, the Church as a teaching Mother seeks with great love to help all form a clear moral conscience so they can make good judgments in agreement with the truth. The Church seeks not first to make doctrinal statements, but to call all to constantly seek the Lord Jesus. This is the work of the Church: to look to Christ with unfailing love and awareness that the final answer to any problem of morality is found in him alone. > We know, though, there is a tragic weakness in human freedom. Man can easily discern that his freedom is inclined to betray the True and the Good. Instead, he chooses to use his freedom for that which is finite, limited, and transient. Man can see a deep rebellion in his errors and negative decisions as he rejects the Truth and the Good in order to make himself into the absolute arbiter of what is true and good. Just as the Ancient Serpent tempted the First Parents: if you choose to eat the fruit, "you will be like God."

"Consequently, freedom itself needs to be set free. It is freedom." (cf. Gal 5:1)
