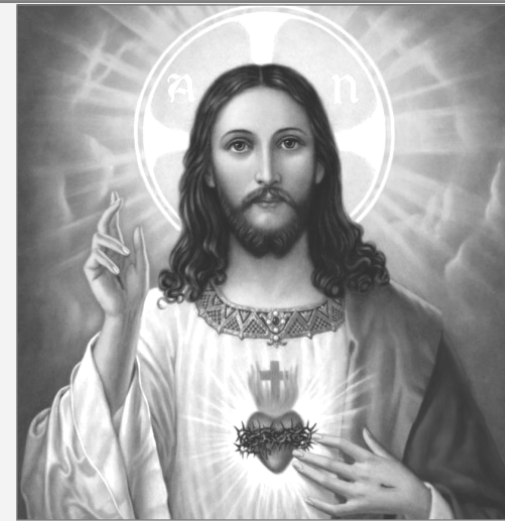

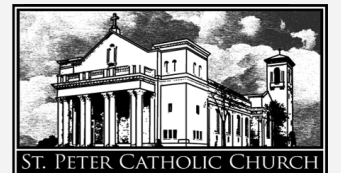

This is an ongoing summary of *Veritatis splendor*, an encyclical by Pope St. John Paul II 30 years ago. This was the first magisterial encyclical devoted entirely to issues regarding a fundamental understanding of the Church's teaching on moral theology. It is a magisterial document of the highest importance and relevance then, today, and ages to come.

Chapter Two – “Do not be conformed to this world”

The Church and the discernment of certain tendencies in present-day moral theology (paragraphs 42-45 Freedom and Law)

In these few paragraphs the Holy Father rejects any view which holds that man is able to create truth himself or to decide for himself what is good or evil. These views are completely incompatible with the Faith of the Church. To uphold this rejection, the Pope speaks of the participation of the Natural Law with God's Eternal Law

If you are an adult not receiving Communion, please do not approach the Communion rail. Children who have not received their First Communion should not kneel or stand at the Communion rail. Children should remain behind those who receive Communion. Children are always welcome at Sacred Liturgies. especially drawing on Sts. Augustine and Thomas Aquinas and further upheld by Vatican II.

St. Augustine defines God's Eternal Law as "the reason or the will of God, who commands us to respect the natural order and forbids us to disturb it." St. Thomas calls the Eternal Law "the type of the divine wisdom as moving all things to their due end." So, all of creation follows God's will and law, except that he provides man a different and closer opportunity to cooperate with his will. He cares for man in a way that man can choose his fulfillment from within rather than it being imposed on him like the rest of the created universe. The Natural Law in each of us may be called man's ability to partake of God's will (Eternal Law) in a most excellent way. "God's plan (Eternal Law) poses no threat to man's genuine freedom; on the contrary, the acceptance of God's plan is the only to affirm that freedom."

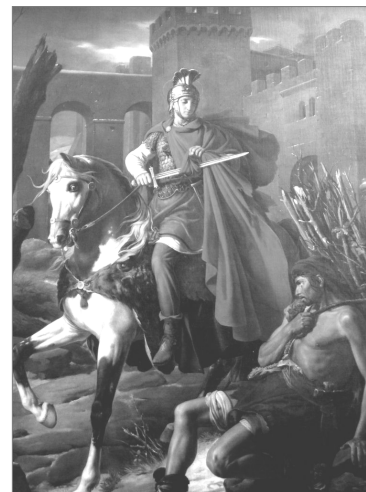
November - Month of the Holy Souls
